

## RECYCLABLE

### Paper (clean, staples OK)

- Mail, office & school papers, magazines & catalogs, newspapers & inserts, phone books, boxes (flatten), cardboard, cereal, cracker & pasta boxes, shoe, gift & electronic boxes, tissue boxes
- Toilet paper, tissue and paper towel tubes

### Glass (empty, labels OK)

- Food & beverage bottles & jars

### Metal

**Special Instructions: Empty, rinse and remove lid. Place loose metal lids inside can, pinch opening of can closed if possible to keep lids inside.**

- Food cans, beverage cans

### Cartons (empty, rinse)

- Milk cartons, juice cartons, juice boxes, soup, broth & wine cartons

### Plastic Bottles & Jugs (empty, rinse, caps on)

- #1, 2, 5 containers, bottles and jugs: Water, soda & juice bottles, milk & juice jugs, ketchup & salad dressing bottles, dish soap bottles & detergent jugs, shampoo, soap & lotion bottles
- Yogurt, pudding & fruit cups, clear disposable cups (no straws), margarine, cottage cheese & similar containers, clear produce, deli & takeout containers

## NOT RECYCLABLE

### Paper

- Paper soiled with food, paper plates, paper napkins, pizza boxes, gift wrap
- Waxed cardboard
- Wrapping paper that is shiny or contains aluminum foil
- Shipping envelopes padded with bubble-wrap

### Glass

- Drinking glasses, ceramic dishes and vases
- Window glass and mirrors
- Light bulbs (take fluorescent and HID bulbs and CFLs to Household Hazardous Waste facility)

### Plastic

- #3 containers like some cooking oil bottles
- #6 Containers like Solo cups
- Plastic bags of any type
- Microwaveable food trays
- Motor oil bottles and other containers that held hazardous products
- Toys
- Plastic utensils
- Garden hoses
- Plastic straws
- Pumps and prayer tops to bottles

### Metal

- Cans that held hazardous products such as paint thinner

### Batteries
